Background

Fferm Goedwig Gymunedol Dyffryn Tanat Valley Community Forest Farm CIC was set up in September 2020. The CIC raised money and purchased 26 acres of upland sheep farm with the aim of creating mixed habitats including woodland, meadow, wetland and ponds. The project will work to include as many members of the local community as possible, both as volunteers and in educational activities.

This tender relates to work being procured under the 'Penygarnedd: Conversion of upland sheep pasture into a community woodland and nature reserve' project being funded under the Welsh Government funded Heritage Lottery Community Woodland Fund in Wales 2020 – 2022.

We wish to appoint a self employed Project Leader and Volunteer Coordinator for a period of 9 months to deliver set priorities as outlined below.

Invitation to Tender Brief

This project will protect and enhance local biodiversity and natural heritage whilst encouraging the surrounding community to connect with the natural world. The community will participate in the regeneration of a degraded landscape, revealing a new set of potentials for upland Wales. We will develop links with schools, farms, organisations and individuals. Written materials will be bilingual to encourage use of the Welsh language.

Elements of the project are:

- Fencing to protect trees and hedging from grazing animals.
- Planting of trees and hedging.
- Pond construction and creation and improvement of wetland.
- Recruiting and coordinating volunteers.
- IT work: creation of website, setting up social media, design leaflet, liaise with Welsh translator.
- Organising publicity and events.
- Risk Assessment, Health and Safety, Volunteer initiation and training.
- Organising land-based skills workshops for volunteers.
- Liaising with schools and other groups wishing to use the land for educational purposes.
- Evaluation of project.

Tender

This tender is for work associated with all the elements of the project outlined above *apart* from the IT element (which can be seen in a separate Invitation to Tender).

Work associated with this tender will include:

- recruiting and coordinating volunteers and overseeing hedge and tree planting by volunteers. There is 1.5 km of hedging and approximately 7 acres of woodland to be planted.
- organising promotion of the project and public and volunteer events.
- undertaking risk assessments, initiating and training volunteers.
- designing and overseeing production of interpretation boards and footpath signs and installation of these.
- organising at least two land-based skills workshops for volunteers.
- liaising with local schools, scout groups, home education families and others wishing to use the site for educational purposes.
- liaising with people doing wildlife and other surveys.
- working with the CIC directors to evaluate the project both on an ongoing basis and after six months and writing an evaluation report for the funders at the end of the project.

The CIC directors will work with the successful contractor throughout the project.

We hope to commence the project in June 2021 and it will be completed by the end of March 2022. We have an identified budget of £10,000 for this work and, as a guide, we envisage that the successful bidder will spend approx. 15 hours per week on the project, over the nine months identified. For clarity, we do have separate budgets for all of the capital works identified above.

We hope to commence the project in June and would need to have the IT element completed by the end of August. We have an identified budget of £3,000 to £3,500 for this work.
